*"I'll walk with you Jesus every step of the way;
I'll follow your will in all I do and say.
I want you to be the Lord of my life;

This is one of the songs that our praise band has been singing lately and sometimes our Saturday night worship crew sings it as well. I wrote that song several years ago. There is a story that goes with the song. As I visited with someone who was struggling to walk, I realized how much I took walking for granted. Pretty much every day of my life for as long as I can remember, I have been able to wake up, get out of bed, and begin walking. Now, if the truth be known, I maybe don't walk as quickly as I used to when I was a kid and there are certainly more snaps, crackles and pops before I get to my breakfast than there used to be, but I am able to walk.

Most of you are also able to walk. For a select few, that may not be the case. For others, you may need a cane or crutches or a walker to help you, but you are able to walk. Have you ever stopped to thank God for the ability to walk, or if you are unable to walk have you thanked God for what you are able to do? I began on November 1 and have typed out something that I am thankful for every day. I have now been doing this for over 130 days and none of the things I have typed have been duplicates. By forcing myself to do this, it causes me to be thankful for some of the little things that I perhaps would have otherwise overlooked.

It also occurs to me that we are continuing to walk through Lent. For many of us that means coming out to church an extra night (Wednesday) when there are other things that we could be doing with our time. For some, it means making soup or bringing sandwiches or setting up before or cleaning up after the meal. It is an added time commitment as we continue our journey. But, we get to be on this journey together. Those who don't take advantage of our Wednesday night mid-week Lenten programming are missing out on some wonderful opportunities for food, fellowship, and learning, praying, and worshipping.

I am also aware that it is a choice. You can choose to walk with Jesus or you can choose to set out on your own. I have no doubt which is the better path! Life always goes so much better for me when I am walking with Jesus. So, as you continue this Lenten journey – as you continue to "walk with Jesus" -- I encourage you to remember to be thankful for the common and ordinary stuff of life and I also encourage you to enjoy and appreciate the journey.

Holy Week and Easter Schedule



We hope you have been enjoying our mid-week Lenten worship services as we have looked at the "Beatitudes of Promise." We continue our Lenten journey as we gather for Holy Week readings Monday through Friday, March 30 – April 3. We will relive the events of Christ's last week on earth through our "Readings for Holy Week." These services are a compilation of writings from the four Gospels interspersed with hymns. We gather at 7 p.m. each evening for these services.

On Thursday April 2, we will also observe the Sacrament of Holy Communion. On Friday we continue our readings while also observing our annual Tenebrae service. The word Tenebrae means shadows or darkness and this worship is a service that begins with a well-lit Sanctuary and as the service progresses the Sanctuary becomes increasingly darker until we leave the Sanctuary in complete quiet and complete darkness. On Saturday we gather at 6 p.m. for our Great Sabbath worship service which is a service of waiting and preparing for what will take place on Sunday.

We gather on Easter morning for two completely different worship experiences. We will gather for our Sunrise Service at 6:15 a.m. in a darkened Sanctuary as we proclaim "The Lord is risen indeed." In this worship experience we pray together the Easter morning liturgy which has often been called the clearest example of a Moravian profession of faith. We will leave the Sanctuary and go to Rock Lake Cemetery to finish our worship, remembering those who have moved on to life eternal since last Easter. Following our time at the cemetery, all are invited back to Fellowship Hall for our traditional Easter morning breakfast. All proceeds from the breakfast will benefit the camp fund.

At 9:00 a.m. we gather for our traditional Easter Worship celebration. **Please make note of the earlier time for worship.** At this service we look forward to special music from our bell choir, our senior choir, praying together the Easter Liturgy and singing Easter hymns as well as Pastor Bruce's Easter message.

We hope you are able to continue to walk with us through this Lenten season all the way to the resurrection.

A Personal Word

Pastor Bruce would like to take a moment to offer a personal word or two:

On the afternoon of February 26, I left the office a bit early to go to visit with my sister-in-law and her children while my brother Paul was having a medical procedure. My plan was to be with them while Paul had the procedure, and when the procedure was done and I knew Paul was stable I was planning to drive back home.

My brother Paul died unexpectedly on that day. So instead of coming home after he was stable, I instead was coming home with tears in my eyes and a lump in my throat. I chose to preach after Paul's death on the weekend of February 28 and March 1. I wanted to be in community with my church family, and I wanted to continue to do what I do so I could keep going. Since Paul's death I have been absolutely overwhelmed with the deepest level of love and support that one could ever imagine.

I believe the words "thank you" seem so empty for what I wish to express to you following your love and support to me and my family following Paul's untimely death. Some of you sent cards, some offered meals, some offered comforting words, some sent flowers, some offered hugs, some called, some emailed, and some probably did something that I cannot currently recall. There is no way that I could adequately thank each of you who have reached out to me or I would not be getting my work done. Please know that I deeply appreciate your love, concern, and ministry shown to me and my family.

I still miss Paul and I am sad that he is gone, but I have no doubt where his eternal resting place is.

Reaching Out Respite


